Speaker Charmion McKusick *"DOWSING BALANCED POLARITY"*

CHARMION McKUSICK has been dowsing since she was 4 years old, for over 71 years. She dowses for information on a daily basis and is interested in all aspects of environmental harmony and has written several books on dowsing applications. In Charmion's presentation *participants will learn the importance of balanced polarity which holds the entire Universe together. When this balance is disturbed, all kinds of things can go wrong. She will discuss environmental, manmade, Feng Shui and behavioral considerations in the balanced and unbalanced states.*

Charmion and her husband Robert have researched remedies for energy problems for over 35 years. Their solutions and articles have been published internationally and translated in Germany and


Japan.

Robert is a past president of Tucson Dowzers, Phoenix Life Force Dowzers, and Globe Dowzers. Both Robert and Charmion are frequent conference speakers.

Both Charmion and Robert with Ray Elkins taught the first college level parapsychology courses for transferable credit in Arizona. They are pioneers in biofeedback and energy photography.

Charmion and Robert were among the 15 dowzers selected by the ASD for brainwave testing of dowzers.

Charmion and Robert founded Biomagnetic Research, Inc. in 1985 to research and make products for energy enhancement.
