Your Consciousness is Reflected by the Universe - Ancient Horary Astrology



Ancient Horary Astrology reveals that your consciousness is connected to the heavens, literally. Horary is the art of answering a question by casting a chart for the moment the question is asked. Jeff has clients all over the world who consult with him on business and personal matters. These include businesses and celebrities in the worlds of film, publishing, and music. Jeff has appeared on

several television, radio, and web shows.

Jeff practices ancient techniques that few astrologers attempt to master, because of the difficulty working with ancient texts and terminology. He practices Traditional Astrology, which includes Electional and Horary Astrology. He also practices Vedic Astrology from ancient India. Vedic Astrology examines karmic cycles, and prescribes remedial measures for clearing karma. These include mantras, yantras and gemstone prescriptions, among other methodologies. He also uses Astro-location astrology to help people determine where to live, work and vacation.

Jeff will discuss how we are consciously linked to the heavens as illustrated in Horary astrology, which allows a person to pose an important question to an astrologer, and have the answer revealed in a chart cast for the moment of the asking. He will also discuss the other types of astrology he practices and tell stories relating to each kind. One story involved a case of a murdered client, whom he warned of danger. This was a high profile story that was featured on a network news show.

TYPES OF BASIC DOWSING TOOLS by Marge Hefty

PENDULUMS

Today this seems to be the most popular tool. It can be any item on a string or chain which can swing freely. Women used their wedding ring on a thread to determine the sex of a baby while still in the womb. Homer Hefty used to give our dowsing classes a nut on a six inch string, with the words "you never knew which end of the string the nut was on". I have used my car keys, which are kind of awkward but they do work and give you yes and no answers. To learn to dowse, hold the chain between thumb and index finger (either hand is ok) and start movement in what is called the 1:00 o'clock swing. Then program pendulum to move to 12:00 for yes (shaking your head yes). And move to 9:00 for no (shaking your head no). Some people use clockwise circles for yes and counter-clockwise for no. Both are ok. If you are using charts (Letter to Robin, by Walter Woods) the first method is the one you need.

Y RODS

Now we are going back to the peach or willow branch. The old timers used to say the tree branch had to seek water. (In Arizona a mesquite branch should work as the roots of it have been found 150 to 175 feet deep.) Today they are made with PVC pipe tied together at one end. You hold them like you would hold a post hole digger and then flip them up and start walking holding in your mind what you are searching for be it water, minerals, lost articles etc. A "yes" answer is a downward pull. That would mean an upward pull is a "no" answer - suggest using "no movement" for no because after you get slapped between the eyes with PVC or a tree branch and find out how that smarts, you will want to forgo having that experience again.

L RODS



This is my favorite tool for water dowsing. Plumbers use them for finding buried pipes. Miners use them for locating minerals and the list continues. Those used outside usually are made from welding rod with 5 inch handle and 13 inch wand in the shape of an "L". A pair will give good readings and if you practice finding your water hose or buried sprinkler system, watch and see where your feet are when the rods cross or spin out. My toes are usually on the water when my rods cross. Either way, cross or spin

out, is an answer. With practice you will learn to tell what your information means. Some rods have sleeves on the handles so you do not interfere with yes or no answers. However, if you have a lot of wind outside this can be a handicap. Solution is to keep a pair of both at hand. Also, rods with shorter wands are nice to carry in your pocket or purse to use indoors. You can program one rod to give you yes and no answers also. See me and I will demonstrate as a picture is worth a thousand words.

BOBBER

This is an odd combination of a l rod, pendulum and coil that looks like a fishing pole. The handle is normally made from wood. It happily bobs along doing it's thing and gives you the right answer. Those who have learned to use it, swear by it and will pick it up first if given a choice. Again you program it to give yes and no answers.
