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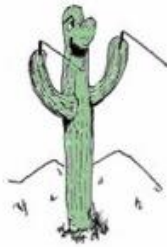

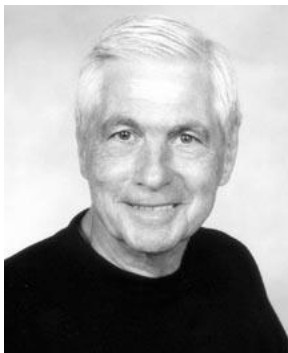

Brian Disbury introduced our speaker, Raymon Grace.

Raymon told us that he had some good news and some bad news. The good news is that there is a group of people who are the most powerful

people in the world – and it is dowsers. The bad news is that most of us don't know it.

Dowsing can be used to check the probability that someone will rob your house, and stop them.

Raymon's DVD Energize your Life will change the energy wherever it is played.

Dowsing stacks the deck in your favor. Better information equals better decisions.

You can check people's integrity.

You can check the mechanical condition of a car you may be considering buying.

Someone filmed one of Raymon's talks and felt a shift in energy when it was played later.

If you choose to work on a project, like a school or a shelter, you need an anchor or a connection to the place, such as an employee requesting help,

or the relative of a student.

Raymon agreed that there were certain times to do certain things—whenever you think about it.

Raymon's associate, Faye Henry, shared a story. Last summer it was very dry and her corn was shriveling in the garden. She tried to get it to rain

with no success. When she asked further questions, she was told she could raise the water table in the area of the garden only, which she did.

When she asked if there would be any negative effects, or if she shouldn't do it, she was told no. After it rained weeks later, she asked if things

could return to normal and she did so.

Water has memory and needs to be cleared of memory of wars, grief, etc.) All the water that's ever been is still here.

Is the spirit of water present? The Spirit of water will not stay where there is a spirit of grief.

We can go back in time and clear people; we can banish the spirit of greed and other non-beneficial energies; scramble their frequencies.

Raymon suggested infusing love, respect, spirit of freedom, etc. into the rain.

When energizing water, invite the spirit of love in; make the water immune to any negative bacteria.

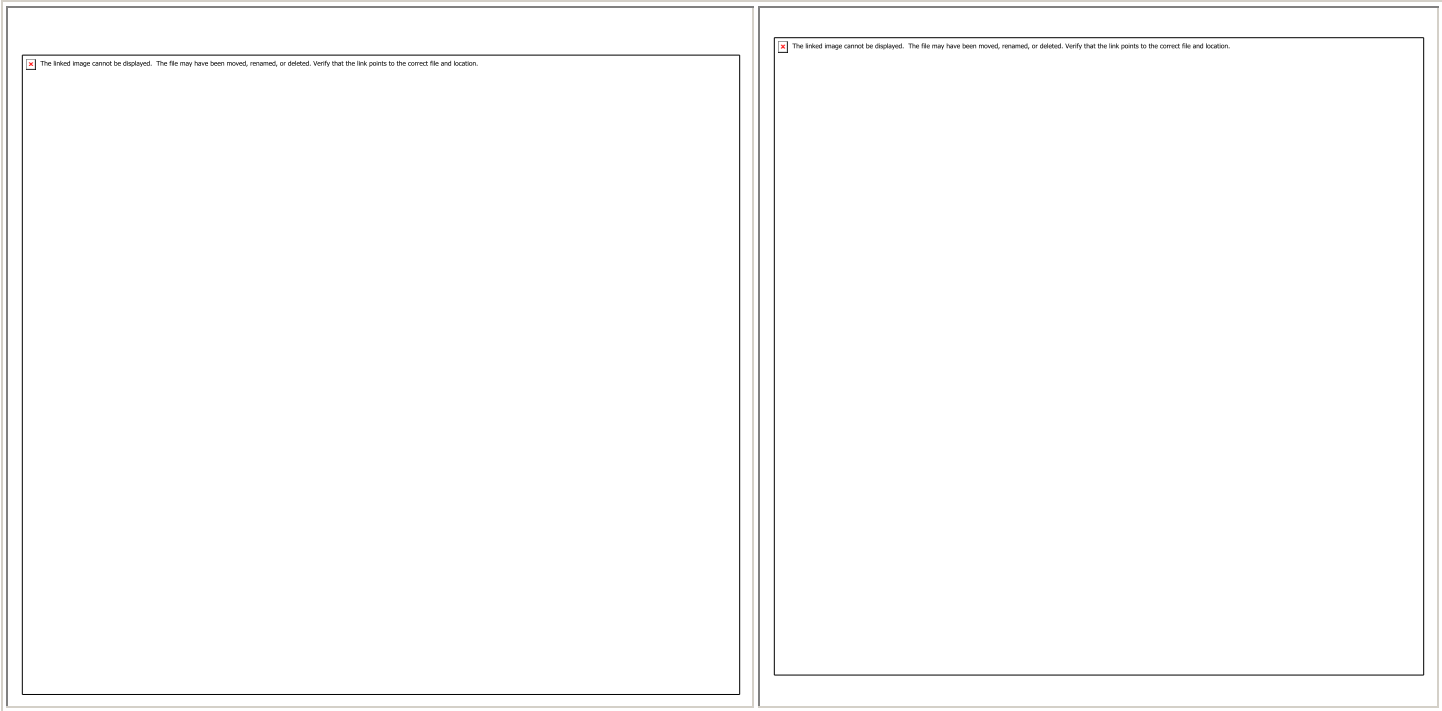
Give thanks to the spirit of water every day.
