Twice, in 1968 and 1970, he has been honored as the only member of his profession to be invited to the Chicago Nutritional Seminar sponsored by Brunswick and Bio-Assay Laboratories.

For 30 years he has been giving weekly lectures, free to the public on nutrition. These lectures were put together to form his two published books, “New Life through Nutrition” and “New Life Through Natural Methods.”

Dr. Deal has very strong feelings regarding nutrition and physical fitness. Probably this is most reflected in the fact that he strives to be as physically fit as he possibly can for he feels a Doctor should be the example for his patient and those who look to him for this guidance in the fascinating field of nutrition.
